The Northwest Center created the ***Friend for Life Award*** in 1994 to honor individuals who have demonstrated an exemplary commitment to upholding the value of human life and empowering the lives of pregnant women and young mothers in need. Previous honorees have included: Governor Robert Casey, Senator Rick Santorum, Senator Sam Brownback, Congressman Charles Canady, Congressman Henry Hyde, Congressman Dan Lipinski, Congressman Joe Pitts, Congressman Christopher Smith, and Eunice and Sargent Shriver, among others.

About The Northwest Center: Founded in 1981, The Northwest Center has helped over 48,000 women and children in the greater Washington, DC area. It operates two complementary programs--a pregnancy center and a maternity home. In 2012, our pregnancy center provided 2,030 individuals with services such as counseling and material assistance, as well as access to prenatal care, medical and legal services, educational opportunities, job training and child care. In addition, our maternity home provided housing and comprehensive assistance to seven women and seven children. The Northwest Center receives no public funding and relies on the generosity of individuals, churches and a few small foundations.
